1 Monthly Report from the Detachment Commander

Inspector Kays introduced Staff Sergeant Fox, noting that he is on a temporary assignment at the Haldimand OPP detachment.

Acting Staff Sergeant Yohnicki was commended for his work at the detachment and within the Haldimand community as he will be returning to Brant OPP. Acting Staff Sergeant Harrop will be filling in temporarily.

PC Patti Cote, Media Relations/Community Safety Officer was introduced and provided an overview of her policing background and role at the detachment.

Inspector Kays reviewed the November and December, 2023 monthly reports with the Board, highlighting the community safety and mobilization, and RIDE program hours. A year-to-date decrease in motor vehicle collisions and a year-to-date increase in violent crimes and property crimes was noted. Year-to-date occurrences related to impaired driving and domestic disputes have remained consistent. An update was provided on the Mobile Crisis Response Team, staffing at the detachment, and ongoing traffic safety campaigns. Discussion ensued regarding calls for service related to the Lawson House in Hagersville, RIDE programs, police presence in Caledonia and speeding on Caithness Street in Caledonia.





Motor Vehicle Collisions

There were 81 collisions in Haldimand County in January 2024. (64 Property Damage, 16 Personal Injury, and 1 Fatal). Collisions were up 52.8% from January of 2023.

Property Damage collisions for January reported at 64. Property Damage collisions did see an increase of 20 (45.5%) from January last year.

Non-fatal Injury collisions for January reported at 16. Non-Fatal Injury collisions did see an increase of 7 (77.8%) from January of 2023. Non-Fatal injury collisions totaled 16 for January. In reviewing the collisions, they ranked as follows: speed – too fast for conditions (5), lost control (3), inattentive driver (2), fail to yield right of way (2), animal – wild or domestic (1), improper turn (1), follow to closely (1) and unknown (1),

Fatal collisions for January were reported at 1. There were 0 fatal collisions in January of 2023. The primary cause for the fatal collision was noted as speed – too fast for conditions.







Violent Crime

Violent Crime for January reported at 28. Violent Crime increased by 1 event from January last year. A year-to-date increase of 3.7% was observed from the same time frame last year.

Property Crime

Property Crime for January reported at 70. Property Crime did see a decrease of 11 (-13.6%) from January last year. A year-to-date decrease of 13.6% was observed from the same time frame last year.

Notable Increases

Sexual assault incidents in January 2024 increased 100% from January 2023(3 incidents in 2023 compared to 6 incidents in 2024). Break and enter incidents when comparing January from 2023 to 2024 went down 71.4%, from 14 to 4 occurrences, including theft under occurrences decreasing by 46.4% from January 2023. Mischief incidents did increase from 10 in January 2023 to 19 in January 2024 (a 90% increase).



There were 60 collisions in Haldimand County in February. (45 Property Damage, 14 Personal Injury, and 1 Fatal). Collisions were up 11.1% from February of 2023. They were up 31.8% year to date.

Property Damage collisions for February reported at 45. Property Damage collisions did see an increase of 4 (9.8%) from February last year. A year-to-date increase of 28.2% was observed from the same time frame last year.

Non-fatal Injury collisions for February reported at 14. Non-Fatal Injury collisions did see an increase of 1 (7.7%) from February of 2023. A year-to-date increase of 36.4% was observed from the same time frame last year.

Non-Fatal injury collisions totaled 14 for February. In reviewing the collisions, they ranked as follows: fail to yield right of way (4), lost control (3), unknown (2), speed – too fast for conditions (1), speed – excessive (1), animal – wild or domestic (1), improper turn (1) and follow to closely (1).

Fatal collisions for February reported at 1. There were 0 fatal collisions in January of 2023. A year-to-date increase of 2 (200%) was observed from the same time frame last year. The primary cause for the fatal collision was noted as unknown.







Violent Crime

Violent Crime for February reported at 20. Violent Crime increased by 1 from February last year. A year-to-date increase of 0% was observed from the same time frame last year.

Property Crime

Property Crime for February reported at 65. Property Crime did see a decrease of 7 (-9.7%) from February last year. A year-to-date decrease of -5.9% was observed from the same time frame last year.

Notable Increases

Break and enter incidents when comparing February from 2023 to 2024 went down 44.4%, from 9 to 5 occurrences (year to date decrease of 60.9% when comparing 2024 to 2023). Sexual assault incidents when comparing February from 2023 to 2024 went up 100%, from 5 to 10 occurrences.
