Some examples of issues that could delay the response were provided, including incorrect address, power outages, network congestion, and technical issues.

- Reliability of the VoIP service;
- Process for routing of and responding to 9-1-1 calls;
- Peace app location;
- What occurs during power outages; and
- Effectiveness and efficiency of 9-1-1 service;
- Factors that constitute an emergency;
- Collision reporting centre and process for reportable and nonreportable collisions;
- Purpose of the \*OPP number; and
- Number of 9-1-1 calls received.
