TOBACCO -SUPPORT OR OPPOSITION FOR SMOKE-FREE PUBLIC PLACES-2013

Haldimand and Norfolk Counties

The Ontario Government passed a law making all enclosed workplaces and public places such as restaurants, bars and places of entertainment smoke-free. Some cities and towns were considering a bylaw that would make other public areas smoke-free. The following questions asked Haldimand and Norfolk County residents whether they support or oppose making other public areas smoke-free.

Between the months of January and May of 2013, 205 Haldimand County and 285 Norfolk County residents were interviewed via telephone. The objective was to measure public support for banning smoking in public places not covered under the Smoke-free Ontario Act (2005).

Results:
