Re: **Results of RFQ, Employment Services Transformation**

The purpose of this information memo is to advise Councils of the result of the Request for Qualification (RFQ) for the transformation of Employment Services and the selection of a new Service System Manager for the Hamilton Niagara economic region, which includes Haldimand and Norfolk Counties.

In consultation with the CAO's of Haldimand and Norfolk Counties, and as per the direction of Norfolk Council as the Consolidated Municipal Services Manager (Staff Report HSS 19-38), the Social Services and Housing Department responded to the RFQ issued by the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities. The Department has been notified that we have not been selected to move forward in the process to the Call for Proposals stage.

It is anticipated that the new Service System Manager will be selected by January, 2020. The transition period for the new employment services system will begin on April 1, 2020 will full implementation in October 2020.

The Social Services and Housing Department will actively work with the new Service System Manager for employment services to ensure the needs of residents in Haldimand and Norfolk Counties who are seeking employment and the rural nature of our communities are understood and considered in the development of the new service system.
