I am writing this letter to respectfully request that the Springvale hamlet boundary line designation be reinstated to its original form as it existed in 1995.



Dear Sylvia:

I am enclosing herewith a copy of the Assessment Map showing your property as being the shaded area. I have had the regional planning department draw on this map the boundary line of the "Hamlet of "Springvale" I have cross-hatched in red the portion of your property that is within the Hamlet designation of the Official Plan. What this means is that the red cross hatched area could, in theory, be divided into building lots. Depending upon where your house is situated, the red cross hatched area could be divided into at least two or perhaps three building lots.
