Good morning Council and staff.

I am writing to inform you that I have received a decision on my request for documents made under the *Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*. As expected, my request for documents related to the county's investments in PPN's through CIBC were rejected.

I also received copies of the 2014, 2015 and 2016 treasurer's investment summary reports. However, the amount Haldimand County paid in commissions on money invested is **not** included in these reports, information I specifically requested. Neither is the actual amounts received on those PPN's which can range from 0 - 6.5%. The total range of documents requested was from 2008 - 2020.

For Craig Manley and Evelyn Eichenbaum, I am formally requesting to be a delegate to speak on the subject of Transparency at the August 24, 2021 Council in Committee meeting.

Given the enormity of the sums involved, \$177 million in 2019, does it make sense that only 4 people have seen the documents requested and only one, the mayor, is allowed to speak about it? Transparency matters.
