## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

Report CDS-03-2023 has been prepared to update Council on the 2022 initiatives, activities and statistics that have taken place within the Community and Development Services Department throughout the year, as it relates to development and vibrancy matters.

## BACKGROUND:

As part of ongoing efforts to be able to communicate the activities, initiatives and impact of the Department's programs to Council and ratepayers, in late 2011 annual performance measures were developed, and in January 2012 a quarterly 'activity' report and an annual report on performance was developed to provide interim updates. Since 2019, the Community and Development Services Department has shifted to provision of an annual report and presentation to provide a summary of activities. That summary is included as Attachment 1.

## ANALYSIS:

#### Key Highlights for 2022:

The world started to fully rebound from the pandemic in 2022, and the Department experienced that in many ways with one of its busiest and most challenging years ever. Despite the increases in work volume and the continued obstacles the pandemic rebound posed to service delivery, the Department enjoyed an immense amount of accomplishment and success. The full details of that work output and the associated community benefit is expressed in Attachment 1, but included below is a sampling of the transformative work that was completed in the year gone by:

- **CityView Portal**: Went 'full live' with e-permitting (electronic application and plan submission, on line payment, electronic permit issuance) and saw 95% of permits submitted through this new service.
- Electronic Plan Review (Bluebeam): Full implementation & staff training of on-screen mark-up of plan submissions/tracking of changes.
- Official Plan Phase 2: Completed public consultation, major background research, policy development, Council adoption and submission to the Province for approval.
- **Parkland Dedication By-law**: Finalized assessment, policy review and implementation of bylaw re: land conveyance and cash in lieu which is an important revenue generation tool.
- **Signage Strategy**: Council approval of strategy and implementation plan for consistent messaging, quality and brand standards that will be applied to all Corporate signage.
- My Main Street & RED Programs: Grant funding secured and used to hire 3 staff for business support initiatives (retention, expansion and marketing) which in turn lead to securing over \$330,000 in grants for local businesses.
- Return of Volunteer Recognition Night in celebration of 80+ volunteers and partner groups.
- Completed Phase 1 of the **Community & Recreation Facilities Strategy** including community survey/public consultation and preliminary community visions.
- Varied supports and guidance on **fund-raising campaign for Hagersville Library + Active Living Centre project** leading to over \$1.5 million in public donations secured/pledged in campaign's earliest stages.
- Community Paramedic Program was expanded to include:
  - Development & launch of County's wellness dog program.
  - Increasing client rosters with 180+ in home and 150+ attending weekly clinics (blood pressure/sugar, O<sup>2</sup> levels).
  - Approval for additional resources to support growth of program vehicles, trailer and staffing.
- Ratification of the new paramedic union contract with OPSEU.
- Developed training program to certify all volunteer firefighters to mandated NFPA 1001 level.
- Caledonia aerial fire apparatus purchased, built and put into service.
