

Motor Vehicle Collisions	There were 64 collisions in Haldimand County in May. (44 Property Damage, 18 Personal Injury, and 2 Fatal). Collisions were down 1.5% from May of 2022. The were down 10.4% year to date.		
	Property Damage collisions for May reported at 44. Property Damage collisions did see a decrease of 6 (12.0%) from May last year. A year-to-date decrease of 18.0% was observed from the same time frame last year.		
	Non-Fatal Injury collisions for May reported at 18. Non-Fatal Injury collisions did see an increase of 3 (20.0%) from May last year. A year-to-date increase of 40.0% was observed from the same time frame last year.		
	Non-Fatal injury collisions totaled 18 for May. In reviewing the collisions, they ranked as follows: fail to yield right of- way (4), improper turn (3), ability impaired – alcohol (2), speed too fast for conditions (2), lost control (2), speed excessive (1), animal (1), debris on roadway (1), driver fatigue (1), and medical/physical disability (1).		
	Fatal collisions for May reported at 2. Fatal collisions did see an increase of 2 from May last year. A year-to-date increase of 0.0% (2 – 2) was observed from the same time frame last year.		
	Fatal collisions totaled 2 for May. In reviewing the collisions, the primary cause was noted as follows: ability impaired – drugs (1), and lost control (1).

Non-Fatal Injury collisions for May reported at 18. Non-Fatal Injury collisions did see an increase of 3 (20.0%) from May last year. A year-to-date increase of 40.0% was observed from the same time frame last year.

Non-Fatal injury collisions totaled 18 for May. In reviewing the collisions, they ranked as follows: fail to yield right ofway (4), improper turn (3), ability impaired – alcohol (2), speed too fast for conditions (2), lost control (2), speed excessive (1), animal (1), debris on roadway (1), driver fatigue (1), and medical/physical disability (1).

Fatal collisions for May reported at 2. Fatal collisions did see an increase of 2 from May last year. A year-to-date increase of 0.0% (2 – 2) was observed from the same time frame last year.

There were 2 fatal collisions that occurred in May.

Fatal collisions totaled 2 for May. In reviewing the collisions, the primary cause was noted as follows: ability impaired – drugs (1), and lost control (1).
