

They were down 10.2% year to date.</p> <p>Property Damage collisions for June reported at 60. Property Damage collisions did see a decrease of 0 (0.0%) from June last year. A year-to-date decrease of 14.9% was observed from the same time frame last year.</p> <p>Non-fatal Injury collisions for June reported at 4. Non-Fatal Injury collisions did see a decrease of 8 (66.7%) from June last year. A year-to-date increase of 19.2% was observed from the same time frame last year.</p> <p>Non-Fatal injury collisions totaled 4 for June. In reviewing the collisions, they ranked as follows: inattentive Driver (3), and lost control (1).</p> <p>Fatal collisions for June reported at 0. 
**Property Crime**
