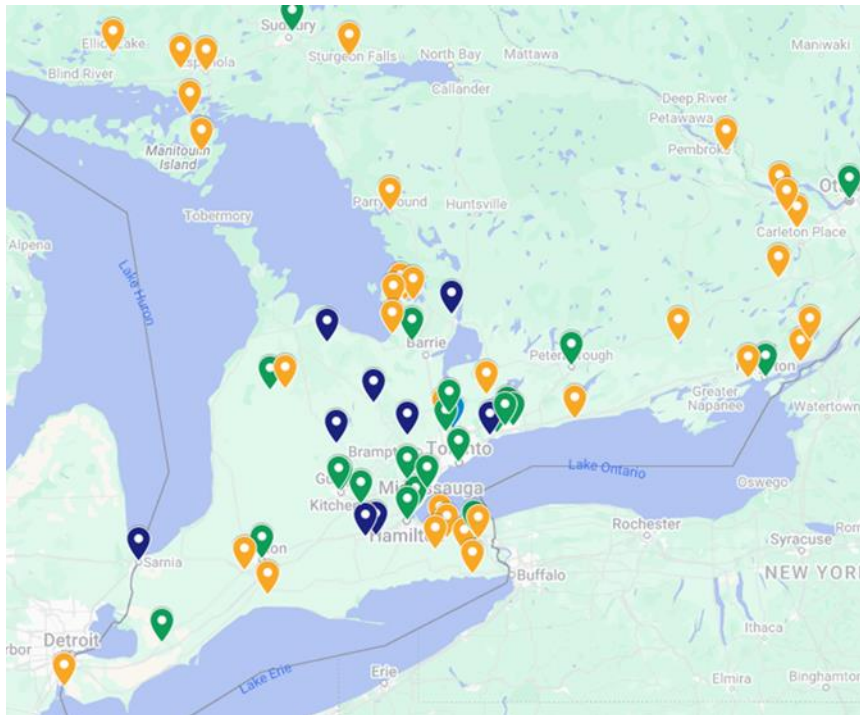


## Age-Friendly Communities in Ontario
