We had our annual Pancake Breakfast and Bake Sale fundraising event on March 3, 2018. Although there were no proceeds raised we feel it was still a successful community event. We had several teenagers from the neighbourhood volunteer this year and 81 people attended from our community.

This year we created a promotion of the TCPC through a publication of how the committee started and what efforts we make to promote a safe community for all.

We partner with the Townsend Lions and the Townsend Community Church. They have both provided the premises, for our meetings and/or events, free of charge. The Townsend Lions have also partnered with us for the community cleanup day and barbeque. This year it is our turn to provide the food and supplies for this event.

# TOWNSEND COMMUNITY POLICING COMMITTEE



Townsend Community Policing Committee was formed in April of 1995 by a group of concerned citizens from Townsend, as a result of numerous incidents of mischief, theft, other crime and problems with youths.

The first years there was an estimated cost of vandalism in Townsend of \$45,000.00. Due to increased awareness, effective publicity and successful initiatives such as foot patrols, this was significantly reduced. Currently there are almost no criminal incidents or damage from vandalism in Townsend.

Neighborhood Links (issued 4 times a year) is our newsletter, which has valuable about crime information prevention, community concerns, and upcoming events. It was started in March 1997. Watch for it in your mailbox or posted at the mail kiosk.

Foot Patrols are conducted by volunteers and supervised by the Committee in partnership with the Haldimand County OPP. The committee also has a working relationship with the Townsend Lion's to organize a community clean-up every spring followed by a barbeque for the volunteers.



The committee has set up an Anti-Graffiti Campaign. When graffiti is spotted, we endeavor to paint it over as soon as possible. Should the graffiti be of hate crime nature, the police will become involved.

The Committee has hosted numerous events to try and assist our community become involved with each other. These events include:

- > Townsend Family Day,
- our annual Pancake Breakfast and Bake Sale, which raises money for our expenses and helps residents to meet their neighbors.

In addition, we have sponsored Emergency Service Days, and hosted the OPP Golden Helmets.



The Townsend Community Policing Committee is a community service group working under the direction of the OPP. Our purpose:

- develop and maintain a partnership between community and the police
- identify community and individual concerns, to address concerns and develop solutions,
- > to demonstrate representation from community organizations and to be a liaison on behalf of the community.

New members are welcome, our meetings are typically the first Monday of every month at the Townsend Lion's Pavilion and we know you will feel good, knowing that you are part of a group that cares what happens in our community.
